The setting

amaZOOnico Wildlife Rescue Center is located within the Selva Viva Protected Forest in Napo, Ecuador, roughly a one and a half hour drive from the nearest city, Tena. The site is only accessible by canoe via the Arajuno River. The project coordinator will stay in a cozy cabin located at the center. Keep in mind this is located in the tropical rainforest, which means lots of insects, heavy rain, high heat, and humidity will be a part of everyday life.

The Position

Join amaZOOnico as a Project Coordinator Assistant, a full-time, demanding yet rewarding role for those deeply passionate about nature and animals. You will work closely with the Project Coordinator to guarantee the highest quality of life for all our animal residents, both long-term and short-term.

Additionally, you will provide cover for the Project Coordinator during their days off and vacations. The main responsibilities include:

Volunteer Management

- Train, and supervise volunteers, ensuring comprehensive understanding of animal care, visitor interactions, safety protocols, food preparation, tour guiding.
- Plan the work schedule for each week.
- Organize social activities to foster a positive volunteer environment.

Animal Care

- Collaborate with other staff members on the care of baby orphans.
- Assist with cleaning and feeding of the animals when needed.
- Plan and oversee wildlife rehabilitation and release programs.

Research and Education Programs

- Apply for conservation and research grants.
- Manage the center's databases.
- Coordinate with researchers.
- Coordinate and lead field courses for high school and university students.
- Manage budget for all research and education programs.
- Lead amaZOOnico learning center efforts.

What is expected from you

Giving the best possible conditions to all amaZOOnico inhabitants (non-human and human). Kindness and respect towards the natural environment, wildlife and cultural diversity should guide all daily decisions. You are expected to ensure that amaZOOnico runs smoothly every day and to possess the following qualities:
